# Asthma Health Outcomes Project: The Research Behind Effective Asthma Programs

Expansive, landmark study conducted by University of Michigan School of Public Health

## Project Goals:

- ► Identify characteristics of successful asthma programs that include an environmental component
- ► Codify success characteristics; Inform ongoing asthma efforts; Guide future funding and research
- ► Facilitate information-sharing and outcome achievement in the asthma community

## What Defines a "Community in Action"

- ► Committed to driving toward the best possible delivery of asthma care
- ► Established bold stretch goals in parallel with Healthy People 2010 and Network Objectives
- ► Tracking progress toward those goals

# Healthy People 2010 Objectives to Anchor the Network

- Reduce emergency department visits
- Reduce hospitalizations for asthma
- Increase symptom free days
- Increase proportion who receive education
- Increase proportion who receive assistance assessing and reducing triggers

## **HP 2010 Targets & Best in Class Results**

Objective	HP 2010 Target	Best in Class Results
Reduce ED Visits	30% - 50% (15-80 per 10,000)	50% – 75%
Reduce Hospitalizations	38% – 45% (8-25 per 10,000)	50% – 80%
Increase Symptom-Free Days	>10 per 14 days	10.4 days in a row
Increase Education	30%	100%
Increase Assistance to Assess/Reduce Triggers	50%	100%


